Meet international authors and adventurers Nicholas and Elizabeth Clinch, as they launch their new book recounting the daring travels of Teresa Harris and her explorer husband St. George Littledale in the late 19th century.

Born at Eldon House in 1839, as the youngest child of John and Amelia Harris, Teresa went on to travel the world with St. George, including remote Tibet, earning the couple fame as Victorian England's greatest travellers in Central Asia. Their story is captured in the Clinches' new book entitled,
